



Demand for flexibility

While the world came to a temporary standstill in 2021 due to the Corona pandemic, a lot of things kept us busy at Women's Hope. In particular, the political turmoil in our partner countries affected us.

The political crises in our partner countries had a direct impact on the implementation of our projects. Due to the takeover of power by the Taliban and the subsequent difficult working conditions for women, we were forced to stop the project against child marriage in Afghanistan. Low-threshold activities are continued by the self-help groups on a voluntary basis. We hope to be able to get actively involved on the ground again at a later date. Women's Hope is determined to stand by the women and girls in Afghanistan during this difficult time.

In Chad, the construction of the second maternity unit using the SuperAdobe method has now been completed. We are happy to be able to provide safe birth facilities to the expectant mothers in Hougouné. In Bangladesh, our partner LAMB again reached many women through the diagnostic fistula camps. Thanks to a surgical intervention, they will be relieved of their fistula suffering.

After a long preparatory phase, we started the joint alliance programme with IAMANEH and Médecins du Monde in 2021. The associated SDC programme contribution will enable us to expand our country portfolios and develop as an organisation. As small and medium-sized actors in the field of international cooperation, we can pool resources and use synergies as an alliance. In the first year of the programme, the focus was on developing a joint monitoring framework. In the near future, we would also like to promote South-South exchange between our partners and, in the medium term, implement individual projects together.






Afghan women now face more challenges than ever.

Strengthening health systems



Access to and use of health services

- **2,830 births** were assisted professionally in healthcare facilities supported by Women's Hope.
- 6,500 women received at least one prenatal examination during their pregnancy, about 2,300 women received postnatal care (at least one visit).
- 265 community health workers received maternal and child health courses.



Strengthening health systems

- 38 health centres and posts as well as 4 hospitals and rehabilitation centres were supported (with e.g., medical devices and products, minor repairs, staff training).
- Over 60 midwife students received support for their education, and about 50 midwives received further training.

Treatment and prevention of obstetric injuries



Treatment of obstetric injuries



Raising people's awareness of fistulas

- 80 fistula operations and other childbirth injuries surgeries were performed.
- 430 patients received the necessary rehabilitation measures and, in some cases, also vocational training courses
- 410 women were screened for obstetric fistula in 10 diagnostic camps, 65 were diagnosed with fistula.
- 1,150 health workers were informed and trained on obstetric fistula.
- In addition, 1,000 traditional birth attendants and 2,500 mothers, teachers and community leaders were also trained.

Eliminating gender-based violence



Raising awareness to eliminate child marriage (Bangladesh)

- 5,500 people, including men and boys, teachers and imams, have been sensitised and/or trained on children's rights, child marriages and gender-based violence.
- 1,230 parents signed a pledge not to have their daughters married before the age of 18.
- 2,520 girls benefited from "safe spaces" where they learn about their social role and menstrual health and can discuss matters freely.

Emergency interventions



Covid and drought crisis

- 43,200 people were sensitised about Covid-19.
- 16,350 litres of water a day were brought to the Somali region to mitigate the effects of the drought.
 8,000 people and various health centres were thus supplied with water for 3 months.



We empower women to claim their sexual and reproductive rights and to resist gender-based violence.

Our approach

In order to strengthen the sexual and reproductive health and rights of women and girls in countries with very high maternal mortality, Women's Hope's work focuses on three thematic areas:

- eliminating gender-based violence (especially child marriage)
- · strengthening local health systems
- providing access to specialised obstetric injury treatment and prevention

As we often work in fragile contexts, building resilience and conflict sensitivity is an important transversal issue. Through our work, we contribute to the UN Sustainable Development Goals 3 (good health and well-being) and 5 (gender equality).
