



## Health gets a new meaning

The coronavirus crisis dominated 2020. The crisis presented a challenge for Women's Hope International in Switzerland and abroad. It clearly showed how fragile the healthcare system is – and not only in the Global South.

Girls and women have been particularly affected by the effects of Covid-19. They were exposed to greater domestic and sexual violence, and many saw their access to medical care worsen. It was all the more important that we have been able to continue our project work – despite the restrictions – almost unabated.

#### Successes despite challenges

Women's Hope is proud to have helped fight the spread of Covid-19. In projects in Ethiopia, Bangladesh and Chad, we were able to quickly and unbureaucratically provide protective equipment and hand-washing stations as well as conduct awareness raising campaigns. This not only protected healthcare personnel and the people undergoing treatment, it also enabled us to continue carrying out ongoing project activities. The maternity ward in Chad and the ongoing fistula camps conducted in Bangladesh are among the highlights of 2020.

In Switzerland we were able to increase awareness about sexual and reproductive health and rights issues as well as raise the profile of our organisation. We developed four new projects in 2020. Three of these projects were launched in Ethiopia in October 2020. In 2020, Women's Hope became an accredited NGO partner of the SDC (Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation), as part of the "Gender Equality & Health" alliance, together with IAMANEH Switzerland and Médecins du Monde Suisse.

### Strengthening health systems



Access to and use of health services

- **2,450 births** were attended with professional care in health facilities supported by Women's Hope.
- **8,430 women** received at least one **medical check-up** during their pregnancy, and more than **1,450 women** received **postnatal care** (at least one visit).
- Thanks to mobile clinics more than **12,600 patients** have received advice and treatment.



#### Improvement and strengthening of healthcare systems

- 38 healthcare centres and stations as well as five hospitals and rehabilitation centres received support (e.g. in the form of medical devices and products, minor repairs, staff training).
- More than 55 midwife students received support for their training, and 20 midwives received further education.

#### Treatment and prevention of obstetric injuries



Treatment of obstetric injuries

- 160 fistula operations were conducted.
- 190 patients received the necessary rehabilitation treatment.
- 260 new cases of obstetric fistula were detected at diagnostic camps.

Raising people's awareness of fistulas

- **980 healthcare workers** received information and training regarding obstetric fistula.
- 850 traditional birth attendants and 600 schoolgirls and local community members were also sensitized on issues concerning fistula.

#### **Eliminating gender-based violence**



Raising awareness to eliminate child marriage (Bangladesh)

- 9,100 people, including men and boys, teachers and imams have been made aware of and/or trained regarding children's rights, child marriages and genderspecific violence.
- **690 parents** have signed a pledge not to have their daughters marry before they are 18 years old.
- **3,850 young girls benefit from safe spaces**, where they learn about their social role and menstrual health and can discuss matters freely.

#### Supported coronavirus measures



Introduction of preventive measures

- **110 trainers** have been trained to sensitize local communities on matters related to Covid-19.
- **35,660 people** have been reached through information and awareness raising measures.
